### Autumn Blanket Bee at Chandler Police Department

Thanks to a wonderful turnout of enthusiastic volunteers, our Autumn Blanket Bee at the Chandler Police Department on October 16 was a great Highlights of the day insuccess! cluded arrivals of colorful armloads of finished blankets, guest speaker Linda Thompson, R.N. of Phoenix Children's Hospital N.I.C.U., a quilt raffle, presentations by AZB4K board and committee members, and most importantly the steady hum of sewing machines and busy quilters! A total of 162 blankets were collected or completed at the bee, with 33 volunteers and board members in attendance.

It was our pleasure to welcome Linda Thompson, R.N. of the Phoenix Children's Hospital N.I.C.U. as our guest speaker. She gave a very moving and informative presentation about our tiniest blanket recipients. At any given time, their N.I.C.U. is home to as many as 50 babies, some as small as one pound. October through December is their busiest time; all but two of their spots were filled that day. With pictures and stories to share. Linda explained that when families come in to the N.I.C.U., "they see wires, tubes and all of the equipment . . . then they see your blankets and it gives them hope."

### **Blanket Guidelines**

We have developed the following blanket guidelines based on feedback from our recipient agencies.

#### **Materials**

100% cotton fabrics in child-friendly patterns and colors. For knitted or crocheted blankets, please use washable, acrylic yarns. We have had an increasing number of requests for flannel receiving blankets and fleece blankets.

#### Construction

All blankets should be machine or hand quilted, or tied every four to six inches with a square knot (except Preemies). These blankets are well-used and need to be durable and washable. If tied, agencies request that we use pearl cotton or embroidery thread as opposed to yarn. Visit our website at www.azblankets4kids.com for pattern ideas or use your own.

If you are using a kit provided by AZ Blankets 4 Kids, *please follow the directions* provided to en-

Knitted or crocheted blankets should be closely knit to protect small fingers and toes and no smaller than 36" X 36" in size (not suitable for preemies).

#### Sizes

**Preemies** 16" x 16" to 18"x 18" Blankets must have flannel backing, no batting and minimal quilting. Either stitch from corner to corner in an X or stitch 2" from edges on all four sides. Do not tie. Infant-themed colors and prints are preferred.

*Infant* 36" x 36" or larger

Toddler 36" x 44" (one yard of fabric)

Child 36" x 44" or larger

**Teens** 40" x 60" or larger

We often receive requests for more blankets suitable for boys or in gender neutral colors and patterns, especially in the Teen size. Thank you for keeping our teenaged recipients in mind.
