We had an excellent crowd of 54 volunteers. Many

were looking for hand work to do or were attending a bee for their first time.

We had 3 to 4 tying tables filled throughout most of the day (photos above and below). Some of these ladies went from novices in the morning to experts in the afternoon and finished lots of blankets for our kids. At the end of the day, our distribution folks took away 170 blankets.

## Chandler PD and Sunland Springs Village Busy Bees

Our Chandler Bee was held on October 18, 2008 and had 39 busy volunteers. We had an excellent demonstration by Eloise Babcock who brought us a new pattern created with strip pieces and very few seams to match up. This was so popular that we put the pattern on our website and include it here on the next page. Thanks Eloise!

This bee finished with an impressive 625 total blankets. Thanks to all who attended and contributed.

The Bee at Sunland Springs Village was held on November 15, 2008. The room was big and bright and full of whirring sewing machines.

We had three big winners at this bee. Two items were raffle prizes plus we had our usual big basket for the door prize. See two of our winners to the left.

At the end of the day we had 173 snugly blankets for our kids.





## The 2½ by 4½ Quilt

This block is a quick and easy block to make when you strip piece it and then cut it apart. You could also use this block to use up those scraps that are too great to throw away but too small for most blocks. (Of course, this takes a lot more time to cut and piece.) Each block finishes at six inches. You will need 70 blocks (7 x 10) to make a quilt that is 42" x 60" without a border.

Let's begin with the strip piecing method:

Cut the width of the fabric into strips that are 4½" wide and 2½" wide from many different fabrics.

Sew the two different sized strips of different fabrics together. Press seams away from the larger piece. Now cut this strip into pieces that are 4½" wide and 2½" wide. Continue cutting until the strip has been completely cut up. Although eventually you will need the same number of each size, some strips may cut up with more of the smaller size. Then with the next strip you can cut more of the larger size.

Salvage

Width of fabric = approximately 42"—44" wide  
Sew together and cut into 4½" widths and 2½" widths x width of fabric

When you have a good stack of various prints in the two sizes, arrange them into blocks. All four fabrics in the block should be different. Put the smaller piece on the right of the larger piece making sure that the two seams do not match. Sew the segment together into 6½" square blocks and press away from the larger piece. Repeat. Although the blocks will be of different fabrics, they will be identical in layout.





## Over 2 Grand from Las Palmas Grand

On Thursday, November 20th, 2008, Joan Most was adding up the total blanket tally after their final sewing day. If she hadn't used a calculator, she would've needed more than 108 people to volunteer their fingers and toes for counting!

The dedicated ladies of Las Palmas Grand donated a total of 2,178 blankets to our kids this past year. I'll type it again so you know it's not a mistake... **2,178!**

If every quilt they turned in needed binding (at 6 yards per quilt), they ironed 12,642 yards or 37,926 feet or 7.1 miles of bindings.

Those are some impressive numbers, but there's more. In addition to the 2,107 quilts and 71 afghans made by this group, 837 hats and 164 pairs of booties were knitted and crocheted.

These ladies have the biggest hearts and busiest hands at work for our AZ kids.

If you live near US60 and Ellsworth, join them in their bright Ballroom on the 3rd Thursday of each month, except December, which will be the 2nd Thursday. Joan and the group will welcome you and show you how you can help.

## Reminder of Preemie Blanket Tips & Guidelines

First, we want to say a big thank you to all of the volunteers who make blankets for our tiniest, most tender recipients. Of the record breaking 10,000 blankets donated in 2008, a generous 2,000 of them were preemie blankets.

Because of the fragile bodies these blankets cover, we have special guidelines for construction.

Here are a few highlights from our complete tips and guidelines available on our website under "Patterns":

- Always wash your flannel before cutting and sewing. It will shrink.
- Do not quilt within the center 12 inches of the blanket. Stitch in the ditch along the border and 1/2" from the edge.
- Always put the label on the FRONT of the blanket. This is for preemies only. All other size blankets should have labels sewn on the back upper or lower right corner.
- Close the opening by carefully hand stitching so no thread loops can get caught on tiny fingers and toes.





## Golden Vista's Annual Sew-a-Smile

The Golden Vista Sewing Room had their annual "Sew-a-Smile" sew-a-thon over a period of two days, January 16 and 17.

The group's coordinator is Thelma Stonebraker. Golden Vista is located on Baseline Road in Apache Junction.

Each March, blocks are cut and kits are assembled. Volunteers take the kits home and sew the tops throughout the year.

Thelma then matches the finished tops with backs. During the two day sew-a-thon, approximately 25 women work to finish the blankets.

This year, on day one, they had 23 workers and on day two, they had 19 workers.



The Sew-a-Smile group has been meeting for at least the last 15 years and has made blankets for AZ Blankets for Kids for at least five of those years.

This year, the group completed 82 various sized blankets and 25 preemies.

Most of the residents are winter visitors and we are so fortunate they spend their escape from the cold making warm and comforting blankets for our kids.

Thank you ladies for the miles of smiles you have sewn into our kids' lives.

## F Troop Motorcycle Group Keeps Giving More Than Ever Before

Our blankets are loved good and hard by our kids. In times of stress, those little fingers and toes are going to grab and stretch and pull that blanket around them with all their might. If we can reduce the stitches that have large, lacy openings, we

think the blankets will have a better chance of surviving the tough love from our recipients.
