During our visit to St. Joe's, Jerenda showed us two holiday blankets that she had personally received when she lost her first son, Christian, between Thanksgiving and Christmas. The blankets are plain cloth panels of traditional red and green. They were a bittersweet token that she didn't know what to do with, so she packed them away. Four years later she took them out when her son Landon was born. They became mementos from a brother he would never know. Then, 14 years later, it was brother Bryson's turn to use the blankets. When Bryson outgrew the blankets, Jerenda knew she would have no more children. She decided to store the blankets with the Christmas decorations. Now Christian's blankets have a place of honor each year under the Nativity set.

Who knew that a simple blanket could become a lifetime treasure?

The desserts were just as impressive. Almost too pretty to eat. Almost. There were four tables of ten, and although we enjoyed our food, we also had a great time talking to new and familiar friends alike.

There was a large display with notes from nurses, pictures of tiny babies with smiling parents and samples of everyone's handiwork. There were soft little beanie hats and booties to fit your thumb; onsies and jumpers and satin dresses for special occasions; and blankets of every color, all soft and anxious to find the babies they were meant for.

Julie Ward, Chief Nurse Executive, said a few words about what our gifts mean to everyone at St. Joe's. And this is a proud grandma who knows what she's talking about. Last year, twins lan and Julia came out to say hello after only 30 weeks in mom's womb. Grandma Julie spent two months in her own Unit visiting, nourishing and cuddling those babies. She now knows from first-hand experience how much it means to have strangers sewing their love, hopes and prayers into every item.

Jazz Attack - A Giving Quilt - by Wanda Dix

Wanda Dix is the driving force behind one of our favorite volunteer sewing groups... Peace by Piece Quilters. We recently caught up with Wanda at the Arizona Quilter's Guild (AQG) Show standing next to her award winning Jazz Attack. The following is Wanda's story of this *giving* quilt.

This quilt, Jazz Attack, was made in 2004 and donated it to the music department of the Middle School that my granddaughter attended. The quilt was used as a raffle quilt to raise funds to be used by their music department. The school decided to use the monies raised to send underprivileged chorus students, with their chorus class, to perform in Disneyland that year. Jazz Attack *gave* a smile to the face of everyone that saw it and provided many dollars in funds.

The person that held the winning ticket was one of my fellow quilt guild members. When her name was drawn I knew she would love the quilt as her daughter is a pianist! And I was so pleased that my quilt was going to the home of a quilter where I knew it would be taken good care of. When I presented her with the quilt, she did something very amazing. She **gave** the quilt back to me! Being a quilter herself, she knows how attached we become to our work, they are like our children.

Because this quilt always makes people smile when they see it (and I like to make people smile) I decided to enter it in the AQG Show this year. To my astonishment, the judges **gave** Jazz Attack a 1st Place ribbon! I had never entered a quilt in a show before and was stunned that I had won a blue ribbon.

It **gave** me a 1st Place ribbon and most importantly, it **gave** a lot of people a reason to smile.

This quilt seems to have taken on a life of its own! It just keeps giving.

You Give to Us and We Give to Who? Or Whom?

We at AZ Blankets 4 Kids know we have the very best volunteers working hard to give our kids in crisis something warm and comfortable to cling to; and we want you to know what happens to your treasured blankets when you trust them into our hands.

In order for AZ Blankets 4 Kids to meet the State of Arizona and IRS "not-for-profit" status under 501(c)(3), we are required to inform, and obtain information from, recipient agencies about how the blankets will be used. We are required to keep a signed agreement on file from each agency accepting the following AZB4K criteria.

"AZ Blankets 4 Kids, Inc. will provide free of charge, security blankets, quilts, receiving blankets, tied comforters, and afghans, etc., to seriously ill or traumatized children. Recipients are children facing the most difficult times in their young lives and shall include those who are suffering the effects of serious illness, fire or major auto accident, sexual or physical abuse, mental or physical disabilities or homelessness."

When an agency wishes to receive blanket donations, an Agency Eligibility Questionnaire is completed by the requesting agency. This questionnaire states our criteria, explains the blankets are to be given - not sold, and that the blankets cannot be used for fundraising purposes. This questionnaire asks about the agency's mission and goals, the ages of the children served, the reasons they are referred, etc.

The Board then reviews the information. If the agency meets our criteria: a letter of acceptance is sent to the agency, a Criteria of Eligibility form is signed by the agency, and blanket deliveries begin.

We currently serve over 30 agencies throughout the Valley. These agencies include hospitals, child protective services, crisis pregnancy centers, schools, missions, fire and police.

It is an honor to receive the gift of your blankets. Please know that we place those gifts into the hands of children who need them and cling to them with hope for better days to come.
