Las Palmas Grand Quilters know how to set goals, reach them, and exceed them! The quilters, led by Joan Most, set a goal of 300 blankets to make in the year 2004. Husband (Tim Most) and friend (Jack Becker) agreed to treat the group to a celebration luncheon cooked by them if they met that goal.

On November 18, 2004, Las Palmas Grand Quilters presented AZ Blankets for Kids with 106 exceptionally beautiful and colorful blankets. With this donation, the group more than earned their celebration luncheon by making over 400 quilts in 2004!! Woohoo!!!

The boys cooked up a finger-licking lunch of hot shredded bbq beef sandwiches, garden salad, and a marble sheet cake for dessert. Yum! Thanks boys!

After lunch, blankets were sorted, bagged and delivered to our kids across the valley. These ladies (and their support chefs) provided over 400 children with a little comfort and security in a time when they needed it the most.

Not wanting to rest on their laurels, the ladies hosted a bee for AZ Blankets on Saturday, January 29, 2005.

During the bee, 267 blankets were collected. Las Palmas Grand Quilters donated 125 of

those blankets. We had a great turnout of 46 people. There were stations for layering, tying, closing and labeling, and kits were available for those who wanted to start fresh.

As a reward for our hard work on that day, the boys cooked for us once again! This time Tim and Jack stirred up two savory soups (chicken noodle and chili), corn bread, garden salad, drinks, and dessert. These guys know how to motivate quilters! Good food with good friends doing good things for the community... what could be better?

# Meet Our Volunteers: Sunrise Village Quilters

Two great ladies, Jean Middleton and Dilly Muehlfelt, lead *Sunrise Village Quilters*. Ten months out of the year this group donates many wonderful blankets to AZ Blankets for Kids. They take July and August off to rest and recuperate.

Jean Middleton hails from Mason City, Iowa. Jean taught elementary school for twenty years and also helped her husband, Ralph, run an auction business. After raising three children, they retired to Arizona in 1985 and Jean went to work for House of Fabrics and then The Bernina Store. Jean had always been into garment construction (her parents gave her a Featherweight sewing machine as a graduation present) but had never made a quilt. About ten years ago, a friend forced Jean to take a quilting class at the "Ranch". She was hooked!! Guess what the seven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren get for Christmas?

Dilly Muehlfelt raised eight children in Arlington Heights, Illinois and after being widowed felt she needed a lifestyle change. She headed west and landed in Tucson but soon followed her son to the Phoenix area. Dilly has quilted all her adult life and has made each of her 8 children a handmade quilt for a wedding gift. Twenty-one of her 22 grandchildren also received handmade quilts. But when number 22 came along, Dilly had gotten rid of all her hoops and frames and was in a dilemma about how to quilt this one! That's when her good friend and neighbor, Jean Middleton, introduced her to machine quilting. Three sewing machines later, Dilly is still quilting for nine great-grandchildren.

These two terrific ladies were responsible for founding and organizing the *Sunrise Village Quilters*. They meet the first

Wednesday of every month, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Sunrise Village Resort, 5402 E. McKellips Rd., Mesa.

Monthly participation varies from 15 to 30 people. Their oldest member is 94 years young and still lugs her old Bernina sewing machine to bees. It is important to note that this group, like many others, is completely independent of AZ Blankets for Kids. They raise their own money for supplies needed to quilt and complete blankets. Dilly says, "Quilting has opened a whole new world to me! Quilters are fun, caring and sharing people." Jean believes passionately in the good that their blankets do for needy children and as some people tithe their money, she tithes her time to sew for AZ Blankets for Kids.

Whether you give of your time, your talents, or your dollars, it all translates into our AZ kids getting to wrap themselves in the warmth and caring that you provide. Thanks so much to the *Sunrise Village Quilters* and all our volunteers for giving so much!
